The voting rules put into place by County lake advisory meetings were challenging to Lake Districts during his While ZOOM meetings were COVID-19 season. allowed, voting on-line could not be allowed since there was no method in place to verify a large vote taken in such a manner.

However, we found that we could be prepared to respond to a result before our annual meeting by administering an advisory referendum vote to learn about the opinion of our District electors. Now that we know that most of you are in favor of a first step, a 6 foot lake drawdown over the winter, we are better able to prepare and propose action plans with budgets.

The official certification of the voting result occurs at our annual meeting. The Board recommends that the referendum "YES" vote should be certified. Your opinion matters to the Board, and views the referendum vote as the membership's final word on the matter.

#### **Shoreline Modifications During The Drawdown**

Information on what one can or can't do, and how much can be done to your shoreline will be addressed by DNR agents present at the Annual Meeting. Even during a lake draw down, the zoning and land modification regulations for the WDNR prevail, and you need to observe these guidelines of face fines.

The referendum was sent using the official County tax role in effect for the 2020 tax season. If you did not get a ballot, please contact MMLMD and check with the Waushara County tax office to make sure you are listed. Total ballots sent out: 198; Total ballots returned: 168; Rate of return: 85%; Total votes cast YES: 190; Total votes cast NO:78. Ballots sent and vote totals are separate since two votes were allowed per property.

#### **DISTRICT CHAIRMAN'S REPORT - Tim Dahlstrand**

The District Board of Commissioners met four times since our last annual meeting. Three open meetings conducted via Zoom teleconference (due to COVID meeting restrictions) and the May meeting was in person. The meeting schedule, agendas and meeting minutes are published on the District website.

The District Treasurer, Peggy Thiel, has prepared the 2020-2021 financial report, which was audited by an independent third party. Peggy will also present the this report and the proposed 2021-2022 District spending plan at the annual meeting.

As a result of changes in the invasive plant populations, quantities of floating plant debris and aging harvesting equipment, the board has begun new harvesting equipment research and options. These preliminary findings will be presented at the annual meeting by Joe Slezak. Will continue to

> operate and maintain aquatic plant harvesting equipment. The principal equipment operator is Cory Hedrick. Jeff Williams is the back-up operator.

As required by the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, a 10-year inspection was conducted by Becher-Hoppe Engineers on the dam and flume structures. Although the report concludes the dam is in good condition with no immediate dam safety conditions, the inspection did identify several deficiencies to be corrected in the next 18 months. These are related to the toe drain repair, concrete flume intake wingwalls, mill building concrete deterioration and updates to the Operation and Maintenance and Emergency Action Plans. ## A Closing Thought After A Difficult COVID Year

The District is regularly welcoming new property owners to the lakes who are joining our long-time members. They, in general, do not have an appreciation of the many state and county-imposed requirements and limitations as to the use of the lakes and their properties. These include such issues as safe boating procedures, shoreline and property development limitations, septic system integrity and combating aquatic invasive species. The District is constituted under the State of Wisconsin and Chapter 33 Statutes.

The elected commissioners are responsible for lake care and rehabilitation. Despite the difficulties and limitations of the last year, the commissioners have performed responsibly as representatives for the District and are to be commended. As volunteers, however, they do not have policing authority of member noncompliance. If conflict matters cannot be mutually resolved, they will be referred to county and state authorities. We are all members of the District and everyone is encouraged to know the requirements of membership, comply with them and to treat each other respectfully.

US TEC; H employs these seasonal employees and they receive an 80% fee for performing all timekeeping, payroll services, and employer payroll taxes. The amounts received by the operators are: Dam and Harvester Operator, \$15,893 and Back-Up Operator \$6,.666. Operator is reimbursed for approved expenses up to \$1,000 in total.
